WITTON-LE-WEAR PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the ordinary meeting of the Witton le Wear Parish Council held on Monday 10th March 2025 at Witton le Wear Community Centre commencing at 18-30.

Present: Councillors H Murray-Leslie (Chair), P Parsons, L Docherty, S Morehead

- 25/01 Cllr H Murray-Leslie welcomed everyone to the meeting.
- 25/02 Apologies received from Cllrs C Cook, L Langstaff-Wood, M Campbell and O Wilson.
- 25/03 The legality of the meeting was questioned due to the low number of councillors present.
Cllr Parsons made appropriate enquiries and determined a group of 3 councillors would be deemed a quorum. With 4 present the quorum was met.
- 25/04 Declarations of interest - none
- 25/05 Minutes of the regular meeting held on Monday 13th January were accepted with agreed amendments.
- 25/06 Cllr H Murray-Leslie introduced the new Parish Clerk, Michael McLaren.
- 25/07 Electronic decisions:
 - * precept agreed and raised
 - * agreed to accept training costs for Clerk.
- 25/08 A68 traffic working group, Cllr Langstaff-Wood's report deferred until next meeting
- 25/09 Christmas lights - Cllr Docherty confirmed these have now been switched off.
- 25/10 Representation by residents - none.
- 25/11 Election Process - The councillors were each given a nomination pack together with a form to be completed as required by DCC to list pecuniary and other interests.
The election timetable was presented:
 - * 20/3/25 publication of notice of election
 - * 21/3/25 to 2/3/25 candidates' submission of nomination papers
 - * 3/4/25 publication of persons nominated
 - * 23/4/25 publication of notice of poll where election is contested
 - * 1/5/25 polling day
 - * 2/5/25 counting of parish and town elections and clerks notified of results.
- Action - Parish Clerk to make link available for counsellors and add to website.
- 25/12 Cllr H Murray-Leslie described the micro grant process. It was agreed to promote this fund. Monies for microgrants are ring fenced. No applications received.
- 25/15 Cllr Parsons presented stage 1 of the 2025 Parish plan development showing the groups in the village, the responsible councillor and contact details for the event.
Cllr Parsons also presented an interviewer's guide to parish plan insight gathering a tool to be used by counsellors to informally interview people in WLW to gather feedback to determine the community strengths, challenges and aspirations.
- 25/16 Witton Word - Cllr Morehead presented some examples of similar publications, frameworks that would be available to use for the Witton Word. Costs to setup a bespoke template for the Witton word would be about £300 with an estimated cost to publish at £125. Action - Cllr Morehead to refresh the quotations.
- Advertising costs were agreed at:
 - * £30 for a % page advert
 - * £50 for a half page advert
 - * £90 for a full page.
- People / companies wishing to advertise in the Witton Word would need to provide a high-quality colour PDF of their advert for inclusion. Action - Parish Clerk to approach existing customers to determine whether they wish to continue advertising in the Witton Word.
- 25/17 Defibrillator. The issue with the failed battery has been resolved. New battery f.o.c. has been supplied by the supplier and is now installed. Action complete.
- 25/18 Correspondence
 - * Cllr H Murray-Leslie gave information on boundary and network changes
 - * CDALC - communication regarding upcoming elections
 - * CDALC - notice of Zoom webinar for small councils to present requirement for affordable housing and security particularly in public buildings
 - * CDALC - Civic cleanup. Cllr H Murray-Leslie described good works already being done in the village.

LOOKING FOR THE LOST NORMAN FONT

Last month a lady called Meg Gilley came to the Parish Church asking for information about her 7 x great grandfather, Reverend John Stackhouse who had been the vicar at St Philip and St James in Witton le Wear from 1675 – 1695. John was 25 when he arrived in Witton le Wear. Some of his children were born in the parish and sadly his wife Anne and a son, John both died in Witton le Wear and were buried in the church graveyard in 1685. John married for a second time and by 1693 he and Mary had three more children. In 1695, John was moved to be the Rector of Auckland St Andrew and St Anne and the family moved with him. Mary had four more children between 1696 and 1707.

Meg asked what happened to the original font as the current Frosterley Marble font was added to the church when it was rebuilt from the lower window sills upwards between 1900 and 1902. The story had been told to me years ago that when the church had been partially demolished, the building rubble was left in the graveyard and local residents were invited to take any of the unused stone for their own use. Recycling 19th century style. I understand that some pieces of this stone can still be seen in gardens around the area. Two medieval grave markers can currently be seen embedded into the porch walls. Does anyone have the original font? I have been in touch with one village family who has a stone bowl in their garden. It probably was used as a bowl for the priest to wash his hands during the services. It was too small to be the original normal font, but will most probably date from the same time. There is a drawing of the Norman font that was done in 1901 when it was being discarded.



We know it is a longshot, but does anyone know where the font is? Meg would dearly love to see the original font, where the Reverend John Stackhouse baptised his son, Megs 6 x great grandfather in the 17th century. Even a photograph would suffice.

Welcome to the Spring edition of Witton Word.

Local elections will soon be upon us, and because of recent electoral boundary changes (based on population size) Witton le Wear is joining the Crook Ward. Previously our representatives in Local Authority decision making have been Weardale District Councillors. Residents might need to spend a bit of time finding out about new candidates, and the Parish Council will need to build working relationships with whoever is elected.

Reflecting on the past four years volunteering as a Parish Councillor, I've found it a really rewarding experience. I am proud of the positive culture we have at the Parish Council - everyone's contribution is valued and we are grateful to all the residents who help us with projects and support our work, as well as making the village a great place to live through their own volunteering. I think we can also be proud of things we've achieved, including making funds available for local groups, organising events, looking after local paths, improving our internal processes to help us to keep our regular work on track, making the village more accessible through dropped curbs, renovating benches, installing information boards and looking after planters. As a Council, we want residents to get involved as much as possible and it's great to have new people on board - we hope that as well as turning out to vote, you might consider nominating yourself or encouraging someone you know to stand.

Finally, a reminder about No Mow May (or 'Low Mow May' if you prefer). Most of us in Witton le Wear are lucky enough to have some space we can share with the smaller creatures who need our help. Any grass left uncut for as long as possible, particularly in late spring / early summer, really will make a difference by protecting habitat and food sources - it couldn't be easier. Liberate some of your lawn and give the bees a treat!
